Graduates of the Developmental Services Worker program go on to find positions in a variety of settings providing services and supports for persons with disabilities. Examples in Thunder Bay and the region include Wesway, OPTIONS northwest Personal Support Services, City of Thunder Bay Recreation & Culture Division Inclusion Services, Superior Greenstone Association for Community Living, Avenue II, Brain Injury Services of Northern Ontario, Community Living Thunder Bay, Thunder Bay Catholic District School Board and Lakehead Public Schools.

Roles include Student Support Professional, Employment Support Specialist, Residential/ Community Support Worker, Advocate, Family Support Worker and others.

Admission Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (or equivalent) with courses from the College (C), University (U), University/College (U/C), or Open (O) preparation levels with Grade 12 English (C/U) Level.
- or successful completion of the Mature Student Assessment.
- or successful completion of the General Education Development Test (GED).
- or appropriate credits from the Academic and Career Entrance program (ACE).

Program Requirements

- · Standard First Aid and CPR Level C.
- Non-Violent Crisis Intervention Training completed within the first semester.
- · Immunizations and TB Skin Test up-to-date.
- Physical demands (possess the physical capability to lift and support people).
- Criminal record check with vulnerable sector screening.

Alternative Pathways

If you do not meet these admission requirements, we encourage you to consider our College Access or General Arts and Science Certificate or General Arts and Science Diploma programs, or Academic and Career Entrance program (ACE); if you successfully complete one of these programs, you will be eligible to apply to programs in the Community Services area.

Accelerated Option

Developmental Services Worker is also available as an accelerated program for those with a college diploma or university degree in community services or other related fields.

Articulation Agreements

Confederation College has agreements in place that permit credits earned throughout this program to be transferred to programs at other colleges and universities.
