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# Overview

The Early Childhood Education Program at Confederation College is designed to give students a broad education in preparation for the meaningful work of caring and educating young children.

Through readings, observations, critical and self-reflections, discussions, and hands-on learning, students will explore perspectives, learn to think critically, and examine their work with young children in early learning and care environments.

Students will be provided with the skills and knowledge needed to plan environments that nurture each individual child and their curiosities through play and inquiry based learning. Students will also plan play-based curriculum and learn ways to build meaningful and responsive relationships with children and their families. Students will have the opportunity to make connections between the blending of traditional and contemporary theories and practice during their interactive in-class discussions, lab experiences in early learning programs, and their three field placements during the two-year program.

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## **Admission Requirements**

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (or equivalent) with courses from the College (C), University (U), University/College (U/C), or Open (O) preparation levels with Grade 12 English (C/U) Level.
- or successful completion of the Mature Student Assessment.
- or successful completion of the General Education Development Test (GED).
- or appropriate credits from the Academic and Career Entrance program (ACE).

It is highly recommended that you have strong interpersonal skills and volunteer experience in an early childhood setting.

If you do not meet these admission requirements, we encourage you to consider the College Access or General Arts and Science Certificate or General Arts and Science Diploma programs, or Academic and Career Entrance program (ACE); if you successfully complete one of these programs, you will be eligible to apply to programs in the Community Services area.
