

Co-op Work Permit Application: Online Eligibility Questions

When you begin your application for a **co-op work permit**, you will need to:

1. Log into or create an [online IRCC account](#).
2. Go to *Start an Application*, then select *Apply to come to Canada*.
3. Click on the blue button that says Visitor visa, study and/or work permit.
4. Respond to a series of “Eligibility Questions” so that the system can identify what type of application you need to submit. The list below is a guide to some of the appropriate answers for the eligibility questions. Please note that this is not a complete list and you should answer all questions as is accurate in your particular circumstances, if they differ from the recommendation below.

Please note that if you also require a study permit extension, you should follow the Study Permit Extension Guide (instead of this document).

Questions	Answers
What would you like to do in Canada?	Work
How long are you planning to stay in Canada?	Temporarily – more than 6 months
What is your current country/territory of residence?	Canada (<i>this application should only be submitted by students that are already in Canada</i>)
What is your current immigration status in Canada?	Student (<i>if your study permit is still valid; if it is not, email for guidance on your restoration application internationaladvisor@confederationcollege.ca</i>)
Do you plan to work on campus?	No. Remember: these questions are only to determine which application you are applying for. Even if you intend to work on-campus, you can indicate No for the purposes of these eligibility questions.
Are you a full-time student at a participating post-secondary institution and want to work off-campus up to 20 hours per week?	No. Remember: these questions are only to determine which application you are applying for. Even if you intend to work off-campus, you can indicate No for the purposes of these eligibility questions.
Have you recently graduated from a participating Canadian post-secondary institution for which your study program was full-time and a minimum of eight months?	No.
Is your work an essential part of your studies (for example, a Co-Op or internship program)?	Yes.
Do you have a written job offer?	No. You do not need a job offer to receive the Co-op Work Permit.
What is your province of destination?	Ontario
Do you also want to apply for a study permit?	No. (Unless you must also extend your study permit)
When does your status in Canada expire?	Enter your study permit expiry date.
Have you had a medical exam performed by an IRCC authorized panel physician (doctor) within the last 12 months?	Yes or No, <i>depending on your situation. If yes, you will be prompted to submit a confirmation of the medical examination.</i>

<p>Have you lived in a designated country or territory for more than six months in the last year?</p>	<p>Yes or No, depending on your situation. If you have lived in a country for more than 6 months in the last year and that country is considered a designated country then you must answer yes and may be required to complete a medical exam.</p>
<p>Do you want to work in one of the following jobs?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • health sciences worker • clinical laboratory worker • patient attendant in nursing or geriatric homes • medical student admitted to Canada to attend university • medical elective and physician on short term assignment • teacher of primary or secondary schools or other teachers of small children • domestics worker, someone who gives in-home care to children, the elderly and the disabled • day nursery worker 	<p>Yes or No, depending on your situation. If you do intend to work in one of the jobs listed then you must answer yes and may be required to complete a medical exam.</p>
<p>Do you want to submit an application for a family member?</p>	<p>Yes or No, depending on your situation. Review the definition of family members and note that you can only submit an application here for a family member that is currently inside Canada.</p>
<p>Are you giving someone access to your application?</p>	<p>No (unless you have hired an immigration professional to submit your application for you)</p>
<p>In the past 10 years, have you given your fingerprints and photo (biometrics) for an application to come to Canada?</p>	<p>Yes or No, depending on your situation. If no, you may be required to submit them.</p>
<p>There are fees associated with this application. Will you be paying your fees or are you fee exempt?</p>	<p>Yes, I will be paying my application fees. There are very few exemptions from paying these fees.</p>
