

Study Permit Extension: Online Eligibility Questions

When you begin your application for a **study permit extension**, you will need to:

1. Log into or create an [online IRCC account](#).
2. Respond to a series of “Eligibility Questions” so that the system can identify what type of application you need to submit. Below is a guide to some of the appropriate answers for the eligibility questions. Please note that this is not a complete list and you should answer all questions accurately according to your particular circumstances, if they differ from the recommendation below.

| Questions | Answers |

| What would you like to do in Canada? | Study |
| How long are you planning to stay in Canada? | Temporarily – more than 6 months |
| What is your current country/territory of residence? | Canada (<i>if you are currently inside Canada</i>) |
| What is your current immigration status in Canada? | Student (<i>if your study permit is still valid; if it is not currently valid, email for guidance on your restoration application at internationaladvisor@confederationcollege.ca</i>) |
| What is your province of destination? | Ontario |
| Do you also want to apply for a work permit? | Yes, I wish to apply for a Co-op Work Permit (<i>choose this if your program has a co-op</i>). If your program does not have a work-integrated learning component, <i>then you can answer no</i> . |
| When does your status in Canada expire? | Enter your study permit expiry date. |
| Have you had a medical exam performed by an IRCC authorized panel physician (doctor) within the last 12 months? | Yes or No, depending on your situation. If yes, you will be prompted to submit a confirmation of the medical examination. |
| Have you lived in a designated country or territory for more than six months in the last year? | Yes or No, depending on your situation. If you have lived in a country for more than 6 months in the last year and that country is considered a designated country then you must answer yes and may be required to complete a medical exam. |
| Do you want to submit an application for a family member ? | Yes or No, depending on your situation. Review the definition of family members and note that you can only submit an application here for a family member <u>that is currently inside Canada</u> . |
| Are you giving someone access to your application? | No (<i>unless you have hired an immigration professional to submit your application for you</i>). |
| In the past 10 years, have you given your fingerprints and photo (biometrics) for an application to come to Canada? | Yes or No, depending on your situation. If no, you may be required to submit them. |
| There are fees associated with this application. Will you be paying your fees or are you fee exempt? | Yes, I will be paying my application fees. There are very few exemptions from paying these fees. |
