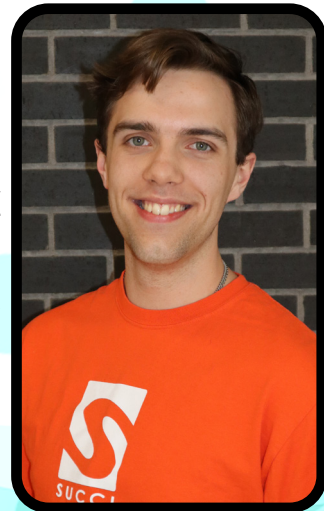

ON-CAMPUS EMPLOYMENT

SUCCI Campus Employment Service administers a part-time employment program for full-time post-secondary students on campus. These job opportunities can give you some experience in your field, customer service practice, and of course a little extra money in your pocket. The majority of positions are recruited for at the beginning of each semester and are posted at “Student Jobs on Campus” at succi.com. With limited positions, we cannot guarantee all applicants will receive a job.

HOW TO GET A JOB ON CAMPUS

- Review the job postings and follow the instructions carefully to apply. All applications are done online.
- Make sure the application is completed fully, including financial information. We ask for this for position funding requirements and it is completely confidential.
- Don't forget to attach your resume and class schedule

ONCE YOU APPLY

If you are being considered for a position, you will receive an email with instructions for your interview, and the next steps, in your college email account. This process will take several weeks.

ONCE YOU ARE HIRED

Once you are hired and accept the position, Campus Employment will be in touch with you through your college email to send you payroll documents. You will need to complete these before you begin working.

UNIVERSAL BUS PASS (UPASS)

The UPass or Universal Bus Pass is an environmentally friendly, cost saving, and safe service which allows unlimited use of the city bus, any time, any day, anywhere that Thunder Bay Transit provides service. Full-Time Fall Intake Post-Secondary Students pay the UPASS fee of \$298 and Winter & Spring Intake Students pay \$205 as part of their student fees at the Thunder Bay Campus. Students can receive unlimited access to any Thunder Bay Transit Bus beginning September 1st, 2025 (Fall Intake) to August 31st, 2026.

If you live outside the area serviced by Thunder Bay Transit, you may choose to apply to opt-out of the UPASS and receive a refund.

The Opt-Out Deadline is:

- Fall Intake - Wednesday September 24th, 2025
- Winter Intake - Wednesday January 28th, 2026
- Spring Intake - Wednesday May 27th, 2026.

USING YOUR UPASS

Your Confederation College student ID (physical or digital) will act as your UPASS. Scan your ID to take any Thunder Bay Transit Bus and go anywhere Transit provides service. ***If you lose your student ID, you have also lost your UPASS.** Students can replace a student card for a fee.

WHEN CAN I USE THE UPASS?

Students registered in the fall semester can use their UPASS starting September 1, 2025 until August 31, 2026. For students beginning courses in January, the UPASS is valid from January 1 to August 31, 2026. Students starting courses in May, the pass is valid until August 31st. COUNSELLING SERVICES

CRISIS NAVIGATION

Confederation College is proud to continue its commitment to student mental health and wellness through Mental Health Crisis Navigator services. Situated in the Student Success Department across from the Hub, the Crisis Navigator is available Monday to Friday, with the ability to respond to all buildings on Campus, as well as the ACE Building and with students at our Satellite/Regional Campuses via telephone/email.

The goal of this role is to work towards a whole-campus approach in effectively managing mental health crises, and to safely connect students with supports available either on campus or in the Community. On-campus Security is vital as they are often the first responders in crisis situations. The Mental Health Crisis Navigator role is tied directly to Security personnel to provide supports to both the student and the people in the immediate environment. Students and staff can be connected to the Crisis Navigator by calling security at 922.

Through tireless advocacy and strategic engagement, OSV aims to influence policies and initiatives that not only meet current student needs but also pave the way for a more equitable and sustainable future.



How We Do It

Through collaboration with Student Associations across the province, including SUCCI, we enhance awareness of critical student issues. Subsequently, we conduct thorough research on these matters to inform our advocacy efforts with the provincial government and other pivotal stakeholders.

Funding for College Institutions

Advocating for stable, increased funding to prevent program and service cuts, ensuring students can access high-quality education and essential supports.

Improve access to education, including regulation on international tuition fees, increasing funding support for students, evaluating and mitigating the costs of educational supplies, and eliminating obstacles to accessing OSAP.



Food Insecurity

Affordable and nutritious food options on campus, as well as support for food banks and programs addressing student food insecurity.



Student Health & Wellness

Accessible and affordable health care services. Ensuring that all services are culturally sensitive, stigma-free and accessible.



Work Integrated Learning/ Skills Development/ Career Prep

Accessible and equitable access for all students in Ontario, addressing barriers and enhancing the quality to be in line with industry needs.

FOOD SECURITY PROGRAMS

EXPERIENCING FOOD INSECURITY? WE CAN HELP!

Confederation College has many programs, initiatives and events aimed at ending hunger in our college community. These include:

- SUCCI's Healthy Nutrition Program - free lunches and breakfasts for students.
- Confederation College Community Garden, plots are free for students to grow food.
- Social Events with Food including Welcome Back Lunches, APIWIN Gatherings, Learning Lunches and more.
- Feasts, Community and Cultural Meals - open to the whole college community.
- Sizzlin' with SUCCI - this cooking program offers cooking demonstrations and workshops to help students learn meal preparation skills and create affordable meals.
- The Campus Community Food Market provides monthly subsidized fresh produce, increasing availability of healthy food.

Watch the SUCCI Events Calendar to find times for these and other events that support Food Security on campus.

STUDENT EMERGENCY FOODBANK

In partnership, SUCCI and Confederation College operate an Emergency Food Bank for students to access. The Emergency Food Bank is not meant to supplement OSAP or personal budgets but to assist students in the rare times when resources for food are unavailable. This service is non-judgmental and confidential.

WHO CAN ACCESS THE EMERGENCY FOOD BANK?

Current students can access the Emergency Student Food Bank service once per semester. Students will be asked to provide a current student card. Students with greater need are encouraged to inquire about additional support options available through Financial Aid and Counselling Services. Upon access of the Emergency Student Food Bank, a list of other college & community support services will be provided to those students showing greater need than the emergency capacity of the Student Food Bank.

HOW DO I ACCESS THE FOOD BANK?

Students can access the Food Bank through the SUCCI Office, McIntyre Main Office Aviation Centre Main Office which are open Monday to Friday 8:30am - 4pm. Supports also exist through the Financial Aid Department, visit the HUB for more information and support.

COLLEGE HEALTH SERVICES

Learning to take care of your own health will be a very important part of your life as a college student. The College Health Centre is here to assist you! Confederation College's Health Services provides primary health and mental health care to on-campus and regional students. Health Services is open throughout the academic year to enable students' access to medical services to help them become active participants in their own health care.

HEALTH CENTRE SERVICES INCLUDE:

Regular clinics are offered during the school year, excluding holidays. Medical professionals will provide:

- Primary care of episodic illness and chronic medical conditions; such as Asthma, Diabetes, and Hypertension
- Physicals — Annual, 3rd Party, Ministry of Transportation
- Tuberculin Skin Testing and advice with regard to compulsory health requirements for specific programs
- Birth Control, PAP & STI Testing
- Health Counseling — Nutrition, Birth Control, Sexuality, Stress, Diabetes, etc.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Most medical services are paid by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan. A health card must be presented at each visit. Out of province & International students should read their insurance policy carefully to determine their coverage.

SUCCI WELLNESS CENTRE MINOWADIIZIWIN

The SUCCI Wellness Centre, Minowaadiziwin, is a modern multi-use facility with fitness equipment and exercise spaces to promote students' health and well-being. It provides an important gathering place for students, employees and the community. Minowaadiziwin means "to lead a good life" and symbolizes the value of the facility beyond contributions to physical well-being and a balanced lifestyle.

Students receive a membership to the Wellness Centre as part of their annual student fees. Fitness programs, fitness testing and personal training are available for additional fees. The variety of equipment, classes, indoor and outdoor exercise spaces, men's and women's saunas, double gym, running track and large windows overlooking a natural setting help make the centre an elite exercise facility in Thunder Bay. Access the Wellness Centre by using your Student ID.

Watch for the development of "THE NEST" Athletes Lounge and Thunderhawks Gallery, as well as additional programs and services as the year progresses.

DOMESTIC STUDENT HEALTH PLAN



All full-time post-secondary domestic students at Confederation College are enrolled in an extended health and dental plan through We Speak Student (Alumo). SUCCI administers this plan on behalf of all Domestic Students.

This plan includes limited prescription, dental and vision coverage as well as some additional coverage. Students may choose to flex their benefits, opt-in family members for an additional cost or opt-out if you have alternate coverage.

- **September start students pay \$288.** (Opt-Out/In/Flex Deadline Sept 24, 2025)
Coverage period: September 1st, 2025 to August 31, 2026
- **January start students pay \$242** (Opt-Out/In/Flex Deadline Jan. 28, 2026)
Coverage period: January 1st, 2026 to August 31, 2026
- **May start students pay \$191** (Opt-Out/In/Flex Deadline May. 27, 2026)
Coverage period: May 1st, 2026 to August 31, 2026

COORDINATION OF BENEFITS

Benefits under two insurance plans can be co-ordinated to increase your coverage up to a total of 100%.

For example, if you have other coverage in place following payment under this plan, you can submit outstanding balances to the other plan for consideration.

HOW TO FILE YOUR CLAIM

Your drug, dental, and extended health care claims are paid by ClaimSecure.

SUBMITTING CLAIMS ONLINE

You are also able to submit your claim electronically by creating a profile with the insurer. You will need to provide your Group number, Student ID number and date of birth when setting up your profile. You must also set up a direct deposit account for reimbursement. Please go to www.wespeakstudent.com and select the "Create a Profile" button.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT HEALTH PLAN

All international students at Confederation College receive health insurance. The cost is covered in your tuition fees and it is arranged for you. Your health coverage is called “**GuardMe @ Ontario Colleges**”.

HOW DO I GET ENROLLED INTO THE HEALTH INSURANCE?

Once the semester starts, you are enrolled automatically with GuardMe. Once the drop date has passed, you will receive a welcome email from GuardMe with instructions on how to activate your account and download the HAC (Healthcare Access Card).

WHEN DOES MY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE START?

Your GuardMe Health Insurance will start on the first day of the month of your course start date (September 1, January 1, or May 1). If you arrive in Canada prior to the start date of your policy, you can purchase Early Arrival insurance.

HOW DO I MAKE A CLAIM?

If you pay out of pocket for an eligible visit, keep your receipts and invoices to submit a claim. There are three easy ways to submit a claim: on the GuardMe Mobile App, online through your GuardMe Account, or mail the claim directly to GuardMe.

ARE PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS COVERED?

Pre-existing and chronic ongoing conditions are not eligible for coverage.

CAN I ADD A DEPENDENT TO MY INSURANCE?

Yes, it is possible. Contact GuardMe for more details.

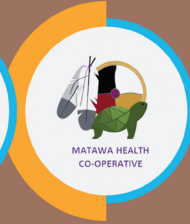

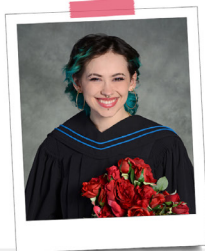

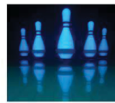
