## Admission Requirements

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) with a minimum average of 60% in the following courses:

- One 4U English
- One 4U Biology
- One 4U Chemistry
- One 4U Mathematics
- Two other 4U/M courses
- or successful completion of the Pre-Health Sciences -- Pathways to Advanced Diplomas & Degrees Program with a minimum 3.0 GPA

## Mandatory Clinical Placement Requirements:

- Prior to entering any clinical setting you **MUST HAVE** all of your pre-clinical requirements completed.
- If your field requirements are not completed prior to starting your placement, you will not be allowed to begin placement. To avoid disappointment, the process of completing your pre-clinical requirements should be done at the beginning of the summer prior to the start of the first semester.
