"I spent the first 20 years of my career putting helicopters together, and I'll spend the last 20 years taking them apart," laughs Laurie Saindon, President and co-founder of Tempest Aviation Group.

Thing is, that taking them apart bit by bit has turned Tempest into a major player in the international helicopter parts market and, thanks to recent deals, the largest helicopter parts distributor in Canada.

After graduating from Confederation College from the Aircraft Maintenance program, Laurie moved to Prince George to work at Northern Mountain Helicopter. He moved up the ranks from field helicopter mechanic to various supervisor roles, eventually becoming Chief Helicopter Engineer. In the late 90s, he left the company for a new position and started a parts distribution business as a sideline.

"We bought two fairly expensive engine parts and we told ourselves, 'If we sell these two parts, we're going to start our own company." They did, and Tempest Aviation Group was born.

Laurie insists that he wouldn't have had the success he enjoys today without his college education. Aside from aircraft maintenance skills, the program also taught him self-reliance, accountability and resourcefulness.

"The aircraft maintenance program prepares you for business too. They expect you to think for yourself, and use creative thinking to get things done. No matter what the problem, you have to find a way to make it work."

He recounted one incident during his program when he put the low-pressure hose he was given onto a system that needed a high-pressure hose. It exploded and hydraulic fuel spewed everywhere. Feeling set up, he walked away until the instructor called him out on it, pointing out that it was his responsibility to ensure he used the right part.

"He said, 'So when you're working in the field on a helicopter and things are going bad - are you going to decide you're going home?" It's a lesson that helped him work through adversity throughout his career, and certainly one that has served him well.
