

Georjann Morriseau is currently serving as the elected Chief of Fort William First Nation. Elected at 28 years old, she took office on April 15, 2013 and is the youngest female Chief in Canada. As a young woman and leader she is faced with the challenge of an ever changing community as she leads her First Nation towards self-sustainability.

Georjann graduated from the Aboriginal Law and Advocacy program and received an Aboriginal Relations Certificate in addition to her diploma from Confederation College in 2009. She has represented First Nations at the community, regional and national level in
