J.P. Remillard graduated from the Aerospace Manufacturing Engineering Technology program in 1989. Before even earning his diploma, he had landed a job with Arnprior Aerospace, Inc. in Arnprior, Ontario and after several promotions is now the Director of Operations.

Grateful for his time at Confederation, J.P. has always found ways to give back. He has sat on the Aerospace Manufacturing Program Advisory Committee for more than 15 years, has been involved in advertising campaigns and continues to hire alumni. Along with the rest of his graduating class, he helped to establish a bursary in memory of a fellow classmate who passed away in 2014. He also facilitates raw materials being donated to Confederation through his employer.

"It's so important that I give back to the College because it's given so much to me. I always got the help I needed and found that even after graduating, my relationships stayed intact, and the support I received from faculty and my fellow students continued."

Beyond his work with the College, J.P. extends his generosity and time both personally and professionally to help support a variety of charities and sports organizations. To his fellow alumni, J.P. says "I think as a Confederation College graduate we have an advantage over a lot of people and it is our responsibility to lead the way in our communities and wave the Confederation flag."

Brenda Chambers-Ivey is such a fan of Confederation, that she now waves the flag as both an alumna and an employee. She works at the Lake of the Woods Campus in Kenora, Ontario as an Academic Services Assistant. Critical to her life experience is having Cystic Fibrosis (CF) and at the age of 38, receiving a double lung transplant which changed her world. Brenda's Confederation journey began after a lengthy recovery from her surgery, in an effort to upgrade her skills and education to assist her with re-entry into the workforce. She has graduated from multiple Confederation programs, most recently earning her Aboriginal Canadian Relations Certificate (2015) and her Business-Human Resources diploma (2007). She believes in paying forward the kindness that she received throughout her journey, and encourages her fellow alumni to do the same.

"Giving your time, talents and experience to your community is something that everyone should consider. My community and Confederation College are part of what makes me who I am today. Looking back, the College helped me to work towards my dreams and pushed me to be a better version of myself. Being a part of the College

In addition to giving back at Confederation, Brenda has put in many years of service with the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, Transplant Manitoba and the Lake of the Woods and Regional Community Foundation. 

Host, That's Hockey 2Nite, TSN Awards & Certificates 2015 President's Award Winner 2015 Premier's Award Nominee "Literally within a year of graduating I was sitting behind the anchor desk, telling the news to the city I grew up in," marvelled Glenn about his first job at Thunder Bay Television (TBT). His mentor Lorne Saxberg happened to be visiting Thunder Bay, and was watching. "He was impressed and told my professor, 'Watch this kid – he's going to go places.' That was really cool for me – it really helped my confidence."

He left TBT for Ottawa, working at first as a videographer/reporter for the news. He was asked to anchor the sports desk on what turned out to be one of the most important trades in Senators' history. Glenn's reporting that night caught the eye of the national media outlets, and soon he was working at *The Score*, doing his own featured segments including exclusives on Sidney Crosby. Then it was the anchor desk again at the NHL Network, and finally at his current job hosting *That's Hockey 2Nite* on TSN.

Glenn is convinced he would not have risen as quickly through the ranks as he has without his Confederation College education. His college coursework gave him a broad range of hands-on experience and knowledge – including in front of the camera, which he may not have done otherwise. It also gave him the technical skills to craft segments - writing, directing, presenting, sometimes shooting, and helping edit.

"Having all those skills at my fingertips was invaluable," Glenn said. "Years later I'd be on shoots with camera guys, and I was showing them little tricks with the camera that worked for me. They'd look at me funny, and I'd tell them, 'Well, I lugged around a camera for five years."
