

### **Alumnus Trent Opaloch**

When cinematographer Trent Opaloch shoots Hollywood blockbusters like District 9, Elysium, and most recently, Captain America: The Winter Soldier, it's almost always in digital these days. But film is most definitely his roots. He started as an assistant to his step-father, renowned nature cinematographer Doug Steele. After graduation, he made the astute move to Vancouver, first working at Shoreline Studios shooting actor auditions and then Clairmont Camera, an equipment rental agency. This allowed him access to professional-grade equipment to build his own reel on weekends. Trent started shooting music videos, then shorts and commercials. He first worked with director Neill Blomkamp on a music video before teaming up on Tempbot. But it was the award-winning District 9 that was their breakout film. Here, Trent solidified his trademark gritty style, anchoring sci-fi/fantasy themes with hyper-realistic cinematography that helps make the story seem so real.

When Trent started looking at film schools, he considered all the usual suspects: NYU, UCLA, and USC. But the tuitions were so astronomical that Confederation College, the "school in my backyard" as Trent called it, became the natural choice. In retrospect, it was the best choice he could have made, he said. "My two years there, those were the basic building blocks of my craft. It gave me the confidence to do my own projects."

Trent is a big believer in giving back to his industry. He had the opportunity to pick the brains of some well-regarded directors including Neill Blomkamp, Peter Jackson, and Chris Carter (creator of The X-Files) and appreciated the help they gave him along the way. Today, he pays it forward by speaking at events when asked and by entertaining questions from up-and-coming directors of photography from all over the world, usually connecting through social media like Facebook.
