Immersive



Students today learn differently than when the theatre first opened. That's why we are converting our multifunctional lecture hall and performance theatre into a "smart" classroom and performance venue with state-ofthe-art production equipment. The plan includes digital audio/visual and technology upgrades with interlinked controls and communications from control rooms to stage. The new theatre will be optimized for the digital learner providing new seating, side tables, and plug-ins for personal technology. And, the space will provide that essential link between our media students and a live audience. New lighting and presentation controls will accommodate lectures, performances, film projects, and even a sound lab for media students using the latest industry tools.

Inclusive



Our new theatre will better reflect nature and the Indigenous heritage of the region where we live for a culturally inclusive learning space. We envision bringing the outside in with finishes that reflect the beauty of Northwestern Ontario: flooring that takes its colour cues from birch bark and stone, a ceiling that sparkles with the wonder of a starry night, artwork from Indigenous artists on wooden acoustic panels, and a circle inlaid on the main stage representing a place to come together. We will also unveil a new Anishinaabe name for the theatre that recognizes the importance of learning in its many forms.

Accessible

Our expectations for accessibility have changed over the last 50 years. The new theatre will meet those needs – and meet Ontario's accessibility standards – for all students, lecturers, performers, and the visitors.

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
